- Identify the anatomy and principles of oncoplastic surgery and select the right patient population.
- Apply clinical tips and techniques for managing tumours in every location of the breast.
- Recognize how to manage potential complications arising from oncoplastic procedures.
- Demonstrate novel techniques for performing good oncoplastic mastectomies when breast conservation is not possible.
- Select patients who need immediate implant-based reconstruction.
- Recall tips and strategies to incorporate oncoplastic surgery in a highly efficient breast surgical practice.

- Show Crescent, Round Block, Racquet and VJ Mammoplasty techniques.
